Who we are

• Cougar Athletic Boosters is a registered 501c(3) non-profit organization managed by a volunteer Board of Directors and supported by AHS/SILSA parents, staff, alumni and friends.

What we do

- Raise funds for the Athletic Department to cover expenses that are not fully covered by the school. Expenses include: repairing or replacing equipment, conference travel and awards, major purchase for the sports and capital improvements to athletic facilities.
- Build school spirit through the sale of Cougar Wear
- Encourage attendance at <u>all</u> athletic events through the sale of booster passes and concessions.

Who we serve

- Over 800 student-athletes participating on 24 school sponsored sports teams (in 2021)
- Over 1,500 students currently enrolled at Asheville High School and SILSA the two public high schools in the Asheville City Schools District
- A student population that is 31% minority and 25% economically disadvantaged
- Family, friends, Alumni and the Asheville Community

- High school athletics benefits everyone by building relationships among the student body, coaches, staff, parents and the community.
